## PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURE A quick guide for Olympia's Bicycle & Pedestrian Advisory Committee

Guiding Prind	Every member has an equal voice. The group is the final authority. It's ok to disagree.
DISCUSSIONS	<ul> <li>No one speaks twice until everyone has had a chance to speak once</li> <li>Members must be recognized by chair before speaking</li> <li>Members address the chair, not each other</li> <li>Members may address presenters directly once recognized by the chair</li> </ul>
MOTIONS	<ul> <li>Anyone can make a motion at any time after the chair has recognized them to speak</li> <li>Anyone can second the motion—don't need to wait for chair's recognition <ul> <li>If no second, motion doesn't proceed</li> </ul> </li> <li>Chair repeats the motion</li> <li>Motion gets discussed, if needed</li> <li>Motion can be amended <ul> <li>Members discuss and vote on any amendments</li> <li>Chair repeats motion as amended</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
VOTING	<ul> <li>When discussion wanes</li> <li>Chair clearly states motion (as amended, if it was)</li> <li>Vote <ul> <li>"All in favor, say aye"</li> <li>"All opposed, say no"</li> </ul> </li> <li>Chair states results of vote</li> </ul>
